The neighborhood known as Alta Vista was built in 1953-54. Alta Vista's geographic area is I -17 to 35<sup>th</sup> Ave, Northern Ave to Dunlap Ave. The neighborhood community consists of 1,655 single family homes, 4 condo areas, numerous apartment complexes, two grade schools, a 7 – 12 charter school and a high school.

In 2003 the City of Phoenix, due to the crime rate and general conditions of the area, designated the Alta Vista Neighborhood as a Fight Back. The Fight Back started the revitalization efforts of the Alta Vista Neighborhood. Through the Alta Vista Neighborhood Fight Back and the coordinated efforts of the City of Phoenix Police many improvements were made and general crime and blight issues improved. Concerned residents at the end of the fight back decided that they wanted to continue the improvements of the neighborhood area and formed the Alta Vista Neighborhood Block Watch (AVNBW).

The Block Watch meets 4 times a year on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of the month, in February, May, September and November. Our meetings are held 6:30 – 8:30 pm.

Our meeting location for the next year is yet to be determined.

The neighborhood continues to change and grow with the times. AVNBW will continue to network with the surrounding neighborhoods, business, churches, city departments and the Police to provide a safe and stable environment for the community. Through communication and education we will continue to address any and all issues that affect our community. The dedicated members/volunteers of the Alta Vista Neighborhood Block Watch work hard to provide a safe place to live, work and grow. **COME JOIN US**

## **Alta Vista Neighborhood Block Watch Grant Information**

The 2020 – 2021 grant year is ending on June 30, 2021. Alta Vista received a grant of \$10,000 for the current grant year. The funds were allocated to the following projects:

- Publish and distribute a quarterly newsletter to all of the single-family homes in our area
- Provide dusk-to-dawn porch light sockets to all residents (this was a 3-year program. If you have not received yours yet, or would like an extra one, they will be available at the G.A.I.N. event on June 9<sup>th</sup>.)
- Replace the metal Block Watch signs in our neighborhood that are faded or rusted.
- **Print literature on crime prevention and safety** for distribution to our residents at Block Watch meetings, or by request (this literature will be available at the G.A.I.N. event on June 9<sup>th</sup>)
- **Purchase crime prevention and safety equipment** for distribution to all Alta Vista residents, available at the Block Watch meetings, or by request. Some examples are solar flood lights, flash lights, door and window locks, etc. (available at the G.A.I.N. event on June 9<sup>th</sup>)
- Various items for our G.A.I.N. event (tables, a pop-up, promotional give-away items)
- Meeting signs
- Administrative supplies for Block Watch meetings

In addition to items paid for by grant funds, we have the following programs:

- We have engravers available for residents to borrow, to mark valuables and forms available to record these items, to assist in recovery of the items if they are stolen (**Operation Identification**)
- We promote the **Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol** (PNP) program, which trains residents in how to recognize and report suspicious activity in the area. This is a 4-hour class (currently held over the internet). We currently have many PNP members, who patrol their area as their time permits, to help keep our neighborhood safer for all.
- We started a "Hello Neighbor" program, which sends a letter to neighbors in our area who are in violation of a City code, giving them an opportunity to correct the violation before the Neighborhood Services Department (NSD) cites them for the violation. ((We have personally received letters from NSD three times in the 38 years we have lived in the neighborhood, and I would have preferred fixing the problem before NSD got involved)
- We assist residents with specific issues and problems (report graffiti, potential crime issues, how to report things on Phoenix@YourService, etc.)
- Keep in close communication with the Phoenix Police Department and our Community Action Officers to keep on top of current issues and work with the police to keep our neighborhood safe.

# Alta Vista Neighborhood Block Watch has received a grant of \$12,000 for the next grant year. Beginning July 1, 2021, these funds have been allocated for the following expenditures:

- Publish and distribute a quarterly newsletter to all of the single-family homes in our area. (In an
  effort to make sure all of the homes in our area receive the newsletter, it will be sent through the US
  Postal Service Bulk Mail program.)
- Install more metal Block Watch signs at the entrances to our area, and throughout the area, so
  people entering our neighborhood know we have an active Block Watch and our residents are watching
  out for any suspicious activity in our neighborhood
- Print literature on crime prevention and safety for distribution to our residents at Block Watch meetings, or by request
- Purchase crime prevention and safety equipment for distribution to all Alta Vista residents, available at the Block Watch meetings, or by request. Some examples are solar flood lights, flashlights, door and window locks, etc.
- Administrative supplies for Block Watch meetings

- Paint house numbers on curbs at no cost to residents, with permission from the residents, so Police and Fire can locate homes quickly in case of an emergency (this is a 3-year program, and will be done only at the request and with permission of the resident. If you would like to have this done in the current Grant year, you can sign up at the G.A.I.N. event on June 9<sup>th</sup>, or email your request to AltaVistaNBW@gmail.com)
- Hold a G.A.I.N. event in October 2021
- Meeting Signs to let residents know of upcoming meetings times and location
- **Zoom subscription**, so we can have an online meeting option available for residents who are not comfortable attending in-person meetings

In addition to items paid for by grant funds, we have the following programs:

- We will continue to provide all of the additional programs listed for the prior grant year
- We plan to increase the participation in the "Neighbor To Neighbor" program, where residents who are elderly or disabled can get assistance with small repair and maintenance issues
- We plan to increase communication and a cooperative relationship between our schools and
  assist the schools where we can (through communication and participation in fundraisers, community
  service projects, etc.)
- We plan to form a better relationship with more of the businesses, apartment complexes and homeowners associations in our Alta Vista neighborhood (we already have a good relationship with two homeowners associations)
